Minutes of the Meeting

Present were Drs. Greenson, Brunswick, Deri, Evans, Fenichel, Friedman, Jokl, Kupper, Rangell, Van der Heide, and Vatz.

The first part of the meeting was devoted to a continuation of the last regular Education Committee meeting of March 3, 1960, bringing up those items which had not been discussed at the meeting.

1. Training Analysts:

There was some discussion about potential new Training Analysts. Of the eligible list, the following names were suggested for serious discussion at a later date. They are: Drs. Samuel Futterman, Leonard M. Rosengarten, Samuel J. Sperling, Rudolf Ekstein, Helen Tausend, and Mrs. Margrit Munk.

2. Child Psychoanalysis Program

- (a) The Child Psychoanalysis program was discussed. It was agreed that Margarete Ruben will be invited to attend those portions of the Education Committee meetings which deal with the Child Psychoanalysis program.
- (b) It was felt that the academic courses for those candidates especially interested in Child Psychoanalysis should not be begun until the third year of the curriculum.
- (c) Supervision of child analytic cases should not be begun before analysis of adult patients is well under way. The Chairman of the Education Committee is to discuss this matter with Mrs. Ruben.

3. Psychoanalytic Clinic

Dr. Brunswick brought up for discussion the policy of paying candidates for Clinic cases after three hundred hours. It was decided that this matter should be referred to the Professional Committee for discussion and review.

This ended the continuation of the regular meeting and the Special Education Committee meeting was called to order.

4. A survey was made of the pre-seminar candidates in order to determine who

might begin first-year courses in the fall of 1960. Drs. Joshua Hoffs, Ronald Mintz, Thomas Mintz, and Morton Shane seemed relatively certain to begin. There was some question about the readiness for seminars of Drs. David Gottlieb, David Thiele, and Simon Horenstein.

5. The following candidates were then discussed: Drs. Hays, Orfirer, Unger, Goodman, Furniss, Carson, Grotstein, Mott, Obler, Schoenberger, Perry, May, Siegel, and Spies. The reports about these candidates will be distributed to the personal analyst involved and also placed in the file of the respective candidate. Only those instances requiring special actions will be listed in the minutes as follows.
6. Special Candidates
 - (a) Dr. Carolyn Hays' request for beginning supervision was favorably acted upon by the Education Committee.
 - (b) Dr. Jokl announced that Dr. William Unger had interrupted his analysis and was now awaiting an opening with another Training Analyst.
 - (c) Dr. Kupper discussed the many positive changes which seem to be occurring in Dr. Mark Orfirer and recommended that he be given Colloquium I and if successful, be permitted to begin a supervised case. This proposal was accepted by the Education Committee, and Dr. Evans and Dr. Brunswick were selected to perform the Colloquium with Dr. Orfirer.
7. Suspended Candidates
 - (a) Dr. Jokl announced that Dr. Hyman Goodman was on inactive status and is now in psychoanalysis with Dr. Walsh.
 - (b) Dr. Greenson reported on the progress of his analytic work with Dr. Charles Furniss. He believed that it was advisable to place Dr. Furniss on active status and permit him to begin a supervised case. It was his opinion that such stress would clarify once and for all Dr. Furniss' capacity to become an analyst. There was some discussion about this matter, but finally the Education Committee accepted Dr. Greenson's proposal.
8. Intermediate Candidates
 - (a) Dr. Ira Carson was authorized to begin a second supervisory case after he writes the Education Committee for such permission.
 - (b) Dr. James Grotstein was authorized by the Education Committee to begin an unsupervised case.
 - (c) Dr. Ralph Obler's request for a third supervised case was approved.
9. The question of length of suspension was put over for the regular meeting due to the lateness of the hour.

10. There was some discussion about the lack of suitable Clinic cases available; and it was decided that there should be a meeting of the Clinic Director with the Director of the Institute, the Chairman of the Education Committee, and Dr. Vatz in order to clarify the situation.
11. It was agreed to have the next Special Education Committee meeting at the end of May.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 P. M.

Minutes of the Meeting

The following members of the Education Committee were present: Dr. Brunswick, Mrs. Deri, Drs. Evans, Fenichel, Friedman, Greenson, Kupper, Lewy McGuire, Rangell, Van der Heide and Vatz.

1. The minutes of the meeting of February 4, 1960 were accepted as distributed.

2. Candidates:

(a) The request of Dr. Neal H. Peterson for graduation was discussed and the Education Committee agreed that he was ready for graduation.

(b) The Chairman reported on his discussion with Dr. Phillip Pennington, who is ready to seek a training analyst for a second attempt at didactic analysis.

(c) Dr. Vatz reported that Dr. Richard Migel had begun therapeutic analysis with Dr. Fielding.

(d) Dr. Vatz requested that Dr. Robert Sokol be placed on inactive status. The main reason for this was the lack of motivation in the candidate. There was a brief review of the Admissions Committee's appraisal of Dr. Sokol.

(e) Dr. James Mott's request for Colloquium II was approved by the Education Committee. Drs. Lewy and McGuire will be the examiners.

(f) The letter from the Baltimore Institute concerning the tax problem will be copied and distributed to the entire Education Committee.

3. Faculty Committee:

(a) The Chairman read a letter from the candidates concerning their pleasure with the special Erikson lecture.

(b) Dr. Heinz Hartmann regretted his inability to talk to us this year but indicated his willingness to consider next year.

(c) Dr. Frankl was granted \$700 as an honorarium by the Board of Trustees and will talk to the members and candidates on May 19th and 24th.

(d) Dr. Fenichel, Chairman of the Faculty Committee, reported on the candidates' opinions regarding the first year courses which were essentially positive. A lengthier report will be copied and distributed to all training analysts.

4. Curriculum Committee:

(a) All instructors of new courses were encouraged to complete the syllabus and bibliography for each course.

(b) Dr. Evans and Dr. Greenson are to attend a special meeting of the Curriculum Committee of the American Psychoanalytic Association in San Francisco on March 12 and 13.

(c) Dr. Brunswick suggested that we remind and encourage the candidates that they have an opportunity to observe nursery school children in action at the School for Nursery Years.

(d) The policy of having assistant instructors for long seminars was reviewed. In addition to serving as good training for young instructors it also is a safeguard for the continuation of the seminar.

(e) There was some discussion about the many evenings of seminar work for the Spring Trimester of this year. The Curriculum Committee will attempt to correct the situation.

5. Board on Professional Standards - APA:

(a) Dr. Greenson was appointed a Fellow to the Board on Professional Standards for the Annual Meeting. Dr. Friedman and Dr. Vatz will decide among themselves who shall be the other Fellow.

6. Training Analysts:

(a) A compilation of the training activities of each Training Analyst was distributed. This sheet indicates the number of candidates in didactic analysis and the number of supervisory hours for candidates and members which each Training Analyst is currently undertaking.

(b) There was a continuation of the discussion concerning the reappointment of Dr. Jokl. Dr. Friedman moved and Mrs. Deri seconded that Dr. Jokl be presented in writing two weeks before the next Education Committee meeting the issues which were discussed by the Education Committee. This will be done in addition to a verbal presentation by the Chairman of the Education Committee.

Due to the lateness of the hour, it was decided that part of the Special Education Committee meeting to be held on Thursday, March 24, 1960 will take up the items which remain from the agenda of March 3rd. The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 P.M.

Minutes of the Meeting

The following members of the Education Committee were present: Dr., Brunswick, Mrs. Deri, Drs. Evans, Fenichel, Friedman, Greenson, Kupper, Lewy, McGuire, Van der Heide and Vatz. Absent were Drs. Jokl, Rangell and Tidd.

1. There were no corrections or additions to the minutes which were accepted as distributed.
2. Admissions Committee:
 - (a) The Admissions Committee made the following recommendations on the following applicants:
 - (1) Edward L. Green, M.D. - not accepted for training
 - (2) Stuart S. Turkel, M.D. - accepted for training
 - (3) Howard Hansen, M.D. - not selected
 - (4) Leonard J. Nevis, M.D. - application withdrawn but also was not accepted for training
 - (5) Myron E. Rappaport, M.D. - selected for training
 - (6) Peter D. King, M.D. - selected for training

These recommendations were approved by the Education Committee.

(b) The Chairman suggested that a few non-Training Analysts might be used occasionally and temporarily to fill in for Training Analyst members of the Admissions Committee when there is difficulty in getting the required number of interviews for an applicant. It was decided that no more than one non-Training Analyst should ever be used in considering a given applicant. The suggestion was accepted by the Education Committee temporarily in order to try out this approach since it would not only help the Admissions Committee but also give us some added information on prospective Training Analysts. Drs. Futterman, Rosengarten and Sperling will be used in this capacity if we should need them. Mrs. Deri will be available for Admissions Committee duty in emergencies when needed.

3. Candidates:
 - (a) The Chairman reported that he had discussed with Drs. Kupper and Brandchaft the situation of Dr. Phillip Pennington who is on inactive status after a short period of didactic analysis with Dr. Kupper. Dr. Brandchaft reports that in his opinion Dr. Pennington is ready to be given a second trial at a didactic analysis. After some discussion, it was decided that the Chairman should interview Dr. Pennington and decide on the basis of this interview whether additional interviews might be indicated or whether Dr. Pennington should be encouraged to proceed with finding a Training Analyst.

(b) The Education Committee discussed the long waiting list of accepted applicants with a view to determining whether we should continue with Admissions Committee activity. Actually only one-third of the accepted candidates are ready now for training analysis. An informal poll of the Training Analysts indicated that among them there would be vacancies for some six new training analyses before October 1st.

It was also recommended that Training Analysts doing supervision with members curtail this as much as possible in favor of accepting candidates needing supervision.

4. Training Analysts:

(a) Considerable amount of time was devoted to a discussion of the potential training analysts among the eligible members of the Institute. The Education Committee came to no decisions but will think over and weigh the potentials of the following members:

At a future meeting, these names will again be considered.

(b) Dr. Friedman was unanimously reappointed Training Analyst for a period of five years.

(c) There was considerable discussion by the Education Committee concerning the reappointment of Dr. Jokl. No final conclusions were reached and this matter will be discussed again at the next Education Committee meeting.

Due to the lateness of the hour only selected items were brought up from the rest of the agenda.

5. Manual for Training Analysts - postponed until the next meeting.

6. Faculty Committee:

(a) The Education Committee approved the appointment of Dr. Maimon Leavitt as an instructor in the Institute.

(b) Dr. Fielding's request for teaching was favorably received and he will be given an opportunity to teach on a temporary basis in the very near future.

(c) Dr. Helen Tausend's request for an opportunity to teach in the Institute was also favorably received and she will be given an opportunity in the Fall to teach on a temporary basis.

(d) The other items under this heading were not discussed.

7. Curriculum Committee:

(a) Dr. Evans, Chairman of the Curriculum Committee, presented a tentative assignment of 3rd year courses for the Spring Trimester. They are as follows:

MINUTES OF THE MEETING

All members of the Education Committee were present except Doctors Jokl, Rangell and Tidd.

1. The minutes of the meeting of December 10, 1959, were accepted as distributed.

2. Admissions Committee:

(a) The letter from Dr. Frumkes of the Institute for Psychoanalytic Medicine of Southern California was read and discussed. They agree with us in spirit but will pursue their own flexible way of processing first year residents. We will do the same.

3. Candidates:

(a) The Education Committee accepted the new policy formulated at the Special Education Committee meeting, i.e., "When a candidate has had 1000 hours of personal analysis and if there is still considerable doubt about his achieving graduation, it shall be recommended to him through his Training Analyst that he seek further analysis with another Training Analyst. The second Training Analyst shall report back to the Education Committee within six months concerning his findings in the situation."

(b) Dr. Kupper reported that Dr. Malin had satisfactorily completed Colloquium II. There was some discussion about what the colloquia ought to teach the examiners as far as the candidates fund of knowledge and ability to express himself.

(c) Dr. Freidman reported that he suspended the training analysis of Dr. Bruce Christianson and the Education Committee placed Dr. Christianson on suspended status. It was suggested that Dr. Greenson talk with Dr. Christianson personally. The application interviews of Dr. Christianson were re-read in order to cast some light on our initial impressions.

(d) Dr. Greenson reported on his discussion with Dr. Jokl. Dr. Jokl agreed that Dr. William Unger ought to be transferred to another Training Analyst since he has had over 1000 hours of analysis and is still considered doubtful. Dr. Jokl further agreed that Dr. Goodman ought to be placed again on suspended status and should be encouraged to seek therapeutic analysis. Dr. Greenson wrote to Dr. Jokl about these two matters in order to facilitate the communication to the candidate. The Education Committee has as yet not heard from Dr. Jokl about the outcome.

(e) Dr. Greenson reported on his talk with Dr. Theodore Polos. It was decided that Dr. Polos should be reinstated to active status. He will take one course in the Winter Trimester and the full first year curriculum in the Spring. Then he should

take Colloquium I and begin supervision. After that, it will be decided when he should once more resume personal analysis and with whom.

(f) Dr. Greenson reported on his discussions with Dr. Edwin Price and Dr. Neal Peterson. Both candidates were encouraged to begin unsupervised analysis in order to fulfill the requirements for graduation. It is expected that both will be ready in the Spring.

(g) Dr. William Horowitz's request for graduation was discussed and his request received favorable consideration. Dr. Horowitz will be informed that he has successfully completed all the requirements for graduation from the Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis.

(h) Dr. Genevieve May was granted permission to begin a third supervised case.

(i) Dr. Robert Stoller was granted permission to begin a case of unsupervised psychoanalysis.

(j) Dr. Leonard Gilman was given permission to begin a fourth supervised case.

(k) Dr. Hulbert's announcement that he had terminated supervision of a case with Dr. Jokl was received by the Education Committee. He shall be advised to coordinate his plans with the Clinic since this is a Clinic case.

4. Faculty:

(a) Dr. Greenson made a partial report on the candidates' reactions to the new curriculum which were essentially favorable. A more complete report will be given next month. Dr. Fenichel reported on the good instruction performed by Dr. Leavitt in her seminar and Dr. Van der Heide did likewise concerning Dr. Rosengarten.

(b) Doctors Motto, Van Dam and Gottesman were appointed instructors in Child Psychoanalysis enabling them to teach in the Child Psychoanalytic program.

(c) Dr. Greenson reported on his discussion with Mrs. Ruben clarifying certain problems of the Child Psychoanalytic Committee.

(d) Heinz Hartmann will not be able to be guest lecturer in March but Dr. Fenichel will try to persuade him to come another time.

(e) The Erikson colloquium will be limited to candidates and graduates of no more than two years duration.

5. Curriculum Committee:

(a) The Child Psychoanalysis seminar has been changed from the fourth year to the Spring of the third year.

(b) The Curriculum Committee made suggestions which were approved by the Education Committee as to the choice of instructors for the new curriculum in the

Spring Trimester. Dr. Goldberg will teach Introduction to Ego Psychology. He will be encouraged to find a co-worker who might share the teaching with him and ultimately substitute for him. Dr. McGuire was selected to teach Obsessive-Compulsive Neuroses and he will contact Dr. Walsh to work with him. Dr. Greenson was selected to teach Fundamentals of Psychoanalytic Technique and Dr. Fenichel and/or Dr. Evans will collaborate with him.

6. Training Analysts:

(a) Dr. Rangell was unanimously reappointed Training Analyst for a period of five years.

(b) There was preliminary discussion about the reappointment of Dr. Friedman.

(c) There was a lengthy discussion about the appointment of Dr. Futterman to Training Analyst status. Dr. Greenson reported that after supervising him for over a year, he only now felt that Dr. Futterman was able to do a good job in conducting therapeutic psychoanalysis. The Committee felt that under such circumstances, one should postpone voting on Dr. Futterman's appointment. Dr. Brunswick moved, seconded by Dr. Van der Heide, that the appointment of Dr. Futterman be postponed for one year. This motion was carried by a vote of seven in favor, one opposed, and two abstaining.

7. Manual for Training Analysts:

(a) The Education Committee voted to amend the present procedures by adding that the supervision of a prospective Training Analyst should be reported back to the Education Committee within three months. Dr. Friedman made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Deri, to rescind the requirement that two Training Analysts meeting jointly shall supervise the prospective Training Analyst. This motion was defeated.

(b) Further items concerning the reappointment of Training Analysts were postponed and will be placed on the agenda at the next meeting.

8. The relationship of the Education Committee to the Membership Committee of the Society will be discussed at a future meeting.

9. (a) Dr. Greenson reported on Dr. Windholz's letter about the Committee on Psychoanalytic Education. The members of the Education Committee of the Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis indicated particular interest in the following items: (1) curriculum, (2) problems of selection of Training Analysts, (3) reappointment of Training Analysts, (4) selection of candidates and procedure for suspending candidates. Dr. Greenson will communicate with Dr. Windholz about this.

(b) Dr. Brunswick appointed Dr. Friedman as Chairman of the Committee to put into action the steps necessary to procure Social Security benefits and other benefits for Training Analysts and other analysts paid by the Institute.

(c) It was announced that the Special Education Committee meeting will take place Thursday, January 21, 1960, at 7:30 P. M. at the Institute.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:20 P. M.
