

At the end of the war and the years right after it the time was ripe for the founding of a local psychoanalytic organisation that would qualify for both becoming a branch of the A.Psa.A. and for training in psya that would be recognized as professionally adequate for psychiatrists who would want to become psychoanalysts. Not only the further influx of trained analysts, but especially the urgent demand for an organized facilities to get together and to get legitimate training made it a natural event when in 1946 the local analysts got together and founded the L.A.Psa.Soc.

Unfortunately, and with tragic consequences for the further functioning of the group, O.F. was not among the founders.

Just a few weeks before the official founding date O.F. died suddenly, unexpectedly and prematurely. He was not the only prominent analyst in residence in L.A. who was vitally interested, most capable and experienced in teaching and training; but his personality was particularly suited, in addition to his professional and scientific eminence, to play the role of a leader of a group of people of very different competence, background, and ~~and~~ leanings. and He was not prone to be deceived by phony appearances, yet capable of

being tolerant and of guiding and integrating and encompassing those elements who had tried hard to contribute to scientific activities without being quite competent to do it.
