STATEMENT TO CANDIDATES CONCERNING
THE FORMATION OF ANOTHER PSYCHOANALYTIC INSTITUTE

The members of the Education Committee have agreed that a change in the structure and function of the Education Committee and Institute is necessary. This decision was reached after much thoughtful contemplation and discussion, since all realized the seriousness of this move. The best solution to the many problems seems to be the formation of another Institute.

This decision has been made because of the fact that scientific differences of opinion have existed for some time, and it is felt that this plan will facilitate the teaching and training of candidates who may choose to receive their psychoanalytic training from either group or both. When the organization plans for another Institute are completed more detailed information will be given to the candidates.

When this plan for two Institutes has been carried through, those candidates trained in either Institute will, upon satisfactory completion of their work, be eligible for acceptance as members of the American Psychoanalytic Association.
