  4. Brunswick: 'Some Political Forerunners of the Split,' (in three sections) -- both in Society and in Education Committee.
  5. Ernst Levy's 'Historical Notes' on Events of the Split.

How to combine this material into a 'History of the Split'?

I would suggest using it in reverse order in the main, abstracting from 4. (perhaps with introduction of the early personal causes from the prehistory), then some details from 3 (a) & (b), then Kandelin's abstracted historical memo. (2, above), finally summary of 1 and of final arrangements (end of Kandelin's memo, etc.)

Dr. Levy's 'Historical Notes' (5, above) constitutes an already written account, into which could be interwoven some points from 4 to 1, as suggested above.

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
