I have examined my files and I find that the name of your present corporation is "Psychoanalytic Institute Foundation of Los Angeles".

It is possible that another corporation was subsequently organized and that I do not have the file because I have an idea that Mickey Rubin did organize such a corporation.

The Articles of Incorporation provide among other things that you may make gifts and appropriations necessary to carry out the objects and purposes of the corporation. Under this provision of the Articles, I think it is quite possible for the corporation to give to the Institute of Psychoanalytic Medicine for Southern California any properties that it pleases provided that the new Institute has the same objects and purposes as the Foundation, and likewise that the gift shall be $\frac{3}{7}$ of the cash plus $\frac{3}{7}$ of the value of the furniture and fixtures.
