INTRODUCTION

This curriculum and bibliography of the Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis has been planned by the Committee as a chronologically progressive course in psychoanalysis based on Freud's writings and other related basic literature.

In compliance with the "Standards for the Training of Physicians in Psychoanalysis" (Bull. A.P.A., Vol. 6, No. 2, May 1950) the courses have been arranged in the following categories:

- (B) Basic Introductory.
- (P) Pathological Formations.
- (M) Scientific Method.
- (D) Theory and Technique of Dreams.
- (L) Literature.
 - (IF) Freud's Writings.
 - (Lcl) Classic Literature Other Than Freud.
 - (Lcu) Current Literature.
- (T) Technique of Psychoanalysis.
- (Clin) Clinical Seminars.
- (Ch) Child Psychoanalysis.
- (Ap) Applied Psychoanalysis.
- (Sp) Special Courses.

Symbols have been used for the identification of courses. Thus the category to which a course belongs is presented by the abbreviations used above; the first digit following this gives the chronological place of the course in its group and the second digit simply indicates the curricular year during which the course is offered. For instance: P is pathology, Pll is the first course (Theory of Neurosis) P21 is its continuation and P31 (Hysterias) all offered in the first year. P42 (Obsessional Neuroses) P52 (Psychoses) and P62 (Perversions) come in the second year and P73 (Character Disorders) in the third year.

The arrangement of the curriculum makes it possible for candidates to start attending seminars either in September or April without interference with the proper didactic progression.

INTRODUCTION (continued)

The seminar on Child Psychoanalysis (Ch 13) is to be taken by all candidates. Additional seminars on child analysis will be offered for those who wish to specialize in this field and these courses will be scheduled during the third and fourth curricular years.

The category Special Courses is reserved for presentations by guest lecturers and such special seminars which from time to time, according to the needs, may be organized.

The Committee has designed bibliographies for the courses as an outline, subject to periodic revision by the faculty.

COMMENT

The academic year (Sept. - July) is divided into three trimesters each consisting of twelve weeks. Each trimester is in turn divided into two periods of six weeks each.

With approval from their training analysts candidates will start attending seminars either at the beginning of the first or third trimester. In the latter case courses of the first and second trimesters will be taken following the completion of the seminars in the third trimester of that same curricular year. The introductory courses Bll Orientation (Theory and Scope of Psychoanalysis and Comment on the Curriculum) and LFll (Basic Freud Writings) always will be the first lectures any candidate attends.

Prior to starting his first supervised psychoanalysis a candidate will take the first colloquium. He will be eligible to do so after he has completed three trimesters of seminars. Ordinarily he will not take his first control case (and in this manner become an "intermediate" until he has taken at least one seminar on Technique (Tll). Clinical seminars are scheduled in such a way that candidates will have completed the seminars on Technique and are conducting at least one supervised psychoanalysis before attending these seminars. Three cases under supervision, the completion of at least six trimesters of seminars and the passing of a second colloquium are prerequisites for attaining "senior status" which authorizes the candidate to accept and treat cases in psychoanalysis without supervision.

All courses consist of twelve hours (six seminar sessions) with the exception of Bll and LFll each of six hours, and the course Pll-21 (Theory of Neurosis) which consists of twenty four hours.

Since the courses have been arranged in such a way as to provide a systematic and progressive presentation of the subject, attendance of the seminars in the sequence set forth in the curriculum is considered most important.
