Minutes of the Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 p.m. by Dr. Vatz, Director of Education. Present were Drs. Atkins, Bail, Brandchaft, Fielding, Leavitt, Mandel, McGuire, Ourieff, Rosengarten, Sperling, Van Dam, and Walsh.

1. Procedures to be followed in the Appointment of Analyzing Instructors:

After much discussion the following motion was made:

Motion: m/Dr. Leavitt, s/Dr. Sperling, that the Certification Council should establish a procedure for acting upon applications for the position of Analyzing Instructor. In accordance with the by-laws applications will be made and curriculum vitae will be requested and submitted to the Certification Council. Also the Certification Council will take into account whatever material is available in the Institute records concerning professional experience: all relevant experience such as teaching, research, participation in study groups, administrative experience, writing, publications, etc. Personal knowledge of the applicant and contact with the applicant by members of the Council will be considered.

Amendment by Dr. Walsh: That Dr. Leavitt's motion apply to future applicants but not apply to the present group of applicants. Amendment not carried.

Amendment by Dr. Mandel: That moral character be taken into account. Amendment not carried.

Amendment by Dr. Ourieff: That the words "along with any other relevant material" replace the last two sentences of Dr. Leavitt's motion starting with the words, "Also the Certification Council," etc. Amendment carried.

The amendments were voted on first and then the motion was voted upon and carried. The carried motion and its amendment read as follows:

Abstract: The infrared spectra of polyacetylene and its derivatives have been studied. The results show that the absorption bands in the 2100-2260 cm⁻¹ region are characteristic of the C-H stretching vibrations of the terminal groups. The intensity of these bands varies with the nature of the substituent groups. The results also indicate that the polyacetylene chains are highly ordered and that the terminal groups are predominantly vinyl and ethyl groups. The infrared spectra of polyacetylene prepared by different methods are compared, and it is found that the spectra are very similar, indicating that the polymer structure is independent of the method of preparation. The infrared spectra of polyacetylene are also compared with those of other polymers, and it is found that the spectra are very characteristic of polyacetylene. The results of this study are discussed in terms of the structure of polyacetylene and its derivatives.

1. INTRODUCTION

The infrared spectra of polyacetylene and its derivatives have been studied by many investigators. The results of these studies have been summarized in a review by Goldstein and Huggins (1). The following applicants for Analyzing Instructor were approved by the Certification Council and their names will be recommended to the Board of Directors for approval: Drs. Atkins, Bail, Brandchaft, Dorn, Fine, Goldberg, Leavitt, Malin, Mandel, Ourieff, Rollman-Branch, Sperling, and Walsh.

The meeting adjourned at 10:45 p.m.
