ARTICLE IV

ARTICLE VIII

- Section 1: The Committee on Child Analysis shall be a standing committee of the faculty appointed in the same manner and equal to other committees. Its Chairman shall be the voting member on the Co-ordinating Council. The Committee shall consist of child-analytic faculty members, and two places shall preferably be filled from the ranks of the members of the general faculty who are not child analysts.
- a. The Child-Analytic Committee will function to organize and sustain a program of training which will prepare its candidates to fulfill the requirements for accredited child analysis as determined by the American Psychoanalytic Association.
- 1) Candidates for the child-analytic program may be accepted from the roster of approved candidates of the Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society and Institute as well as from the active members of the Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society and Institute.
 - 2) The Chairman of the Child-Analytic Committee will appoint non-voting liaison members of his faculty, as necessary, to the Admissions- , Candidates-Evaluation- , and Curriculum Committees. He will

be the Chairman of the child-analytic faculty.

It will be his duty to keep his Committee apprised of the details of the deliberations of the Co-ordinating Council.

- b. The faculty of the child-analytic teaching program shall be selected by the Child-Analytic Committee from the faculty of the Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society and Institute. (It may include temporary appointments of the other qualified persons as recommended by the Chairman of the Child-Analytic Committee to the Faculty Committee as provided in Article IV Sec. 2f.)
 - 1) The child-analytic faculty shall consist of:
 - a) members of the faculty who are recommended by the Child-Analytic Committee and appointed by the Faculty Committee and Board of Directors.
 - b) Members of the child-analytic faculty who were on the child-analytic faculty on April 1, 1968, and who have participated in the actual teaching in the past four years.
 - 2) No child-analytic faculty member shall have legal tenure. Appeal and revocation procedures shall be as outlined in Chapter III, Article 1.
- c. The initial four child-analyst members of the Child-Analytic Committee will be elected by the present child-analytic faculty and the other two members appointed by the Co-ordinating Council; those six shall elect

the initial Chairman. The Chairman shall also be selected from the child-analytic members of the Committee. In case of a tie requiring a runoff, this shall be done. (The first individual elected as Chairman by the faculty, if serving less than one year at the time of regular elections to the position of Committee Chairman, shall not be deemed to be succeeding himself if re-elected.) The tenure of service on this Committee will be distributed in conformity with the provisions for the initial formation of the other faculty committees with the added provision that two child analysts will serve for four years and two child analysts for two years.

- d. The curriculum shall be formulated by the Child-Analytic Committee, subject to approval by the Curriculum Committee.
- e. Appointments to the position of Supervisor in Child Analysis shall be made by the Certification Council and Board of Directors from names supplied (but not limited to these above) by a majority vote of the Child-Analytic Committee. (And in all cases appointees' qualifications must be consonant with the training standards of the American Psychoanalytic Association regarding supervisors in child analysis.)
 - 1) Members of the faculty seeking an appointment as Supervisor in Child Analysis shall be approved in the same way as other supervisors and have recourse to the same mechanisms to ascertain their qualifications as specified in Article V of Chapter III.
