Since our last information sheet (Feb.20, 1968) some interesting new people have been added to the list of those available for analysis through the Clinic. A few have started analysis. Here is the current situation:

Case #1

No longer available. He accepted an appointment to Harvard Law School and will apply to the Boston Clinic.

Case #2

Withdrawn from Clinic to continue therapy with member.

Case #3

Accepted June, 1966, 42-year-old housewife with five children. Dissatisfaction with her marriage, religion, and inability to express feelings. Had two years of therapy with one of our candidates who then referred her to the Clinic. Father suicided when girl was six. Chronic depression in a compulsive character.

Case #4

Accepted December, 1966, 38-year-old housewife with four children. Has teaching credential. Fairly recent outbreak of anxiety and palpitations. Father suicided when she was 10. Has started once-a-week therapy with a member while waiting for analysis.

Case #5

Accepted March, 1967, 26-year-old, single, secretary. Inhibited girl who developed obsessional thinking when she began dating in college. Also developed spasm of chest-wall muscles. Has some therapy.

Case #6

Started analysis with a candidate.

Case #7

Accepted March, 1965. Went into therapy with a member who felt she needed pre-analytic work. Returned to the Clinic July, 1967, ready for analysis. 25-year-old single girl who bore a child out of wedlock. Depressed. Obese. Much integrity and motivation. Identity struggle.

Case #8

Accepted December, 1967, 32-year-old lawyer. Never able to hold a job because of severe characterological problems that cause him to act on his own responsibility in matters on which he should consult superiors, react strongly to criticism, and be fired.

Case #9

Started analysis with a member.

Case #10

Accepted in February, 1968. He is a 31-year-old, married man whose wife is in analysis. He has schlepped along in a low-powered, one-man business. He is beginning to face up to how restricted are his relations with people because of his obsessive character and use of isolation.

Case #11

Accepted March, 1968, 25-year-old single male pharmacy student. Five year history of impotence. Fiercely determined to overcome this. Only one of Texas family to pull self out of a rut. Obsessive character.

Case #12

Accepted May, 1968, 22-year-old woman, physicist. Depressed over separation from husband. Just started analysis with a member.

Case #13

Accepted June, 1968, 30-year-old male systems programmer. Separated from wife. Was in treatment with a member for social inhibitions and depressions. Well motivated.

Case #14

Accepted June, 1968, 24-year-old single girl, artist/potter. Had long treatment through adolescence with a member. Depression in a girl with identity problems.

Case #15

Accepted June, 1968, 27-year-old single woman. Works with disturbed children. Had therapy with a member. Oral character neurosis. Well motivated.
