Speaker: Ralph R. Greenson, M. D.

Subject: "The 'Real' Relation Between
Patient and the Psychoanalyst"

This presentation is an attempt to explore further into the nature of the therapeutic processes which occur during psychoanalytic treatment. There are psychoanalysts who believe that all the patient's meaningful reactions to the person of the analyst are transference manifestations and the only important interventions are transference interpretations. This is the well-known attitude of the Kleinian School as well as the more "conservative" classical analysts. On the other hand, there is a growing number of diverse psychoanalysts who do not deny the special value of transference phenomena and transference interpretations, but they maintain the total object relationship between the patient and the analyst is important. In this paper an attempt will be made to separate transference relations from real relations and indicate similarities and differences in handling them.
