Minutes of the Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by Dr. Sperling, President. There were thirty-four members present.

1. The minutes of the meeting of October 17, 1963, were accepted with the following addition by Dr. Futterman to paragraph 4.e: The course being given by the UCLA Medical School will be held in Mexico City.

2. Membership Committee - Dr. Tausend:

Dr. Leonard Gilman was unanimously elected to Active Membership in the Society.

3. Reports from Committees:

a. Committee for the History of the Society - Dr. Kandelin:

Dr. Kandelin acknowledged the excellent support and co-operation of the membership toward the goal of collecting, recording, and organizing the history of psychoanalysis in California (not only of this Society). He reviewed the activities of the Committee to date, noting that there had been a total of eighteen interviews with twelve subjects. The members were urged to donate any suitable materials such as photographs, documents, etc., for the archives. Further interviews are needed with non-analysts as well for the completion of the project and the elaboration of a narrative history.

Following Dr. Kandelin's detailing of the need for an additional \$600 (from Institute and Society) for the project, it was moved by Dr. Rosow, s/Dr. Barnard, that the Society appropriate \$300 for the continuation and completion of the initial phase of data collection; m/c unanimously.

b. Arrangments Committee - Dr. Mandel:

The West Coast Psychoanalytic Societies' Meeting is presently being organized, the Presidents having met and decided that the next meeting would be held the last weekend in September, 1964, in San Diego. Drs. Mandel, Obler, and Thickstun will represent our Society's Arrangements Committee; Dr. Barnard will represent the Program Committee.

Consideration of the Christmas party is urgent, and Dr. Mandel requested the opinions of the membership after reviewing the history of the parties. After some discussion, the predominant view tended toward an evening cocktail party the Friday night before Christmas, with spouses; the issue was closed by empowering Dr. Mandel and his Committee to make specific plans and conclude the arrangements, which will be announced.
