Dear Doctor Simmel:

I have just completed a revision of our Order Sheets for our sanitarium and, in general, the hospitalized patients. I have thought about you a good many times since I have been working on these and want to send you a set of them to look over. In addition, I am sending you an Abbreviated Guide to the Therapeutic Aims, which is self-explanatory and is to be used in conjunction with the Order Sheets as an aid to the physician and the therapist.
