Minutes of the Meeting

The following members of the Education Committee were present: Dr. Greenson, Chairman, Mrs. Deri, Drs. Brunswick, Friedman, Evans, Fenichel, Jokl, McGuire, Rangell, Van der Heide and Vatz.

1. This special meeting was called by the Chairman in order to discuss procedure and policy in connection with the situation of Dr. Robert Minnick. Mrs. Deri presented a brief description of her meeting with him and her opinion about the prognosis. Several members discussed the advisability of rescinding the previous acceptance of the Education Committee. It was finally decided that Mrs. Deri would either see or write to Dr. Minnick and advise him that in her opinion he should have a therapeutic analysis and further to advise him that she will so inform the Education Committee. It will then be suggested to Dr. Minnick that he contact the Chairman of the Education Committee. If this is done and the findings and the opinion of the Chairman coincide with those of Mrs. Deri, Dr. Minnick will be told that his acceptance will be withdrawn and he will be advised to enter a therapeutic analysis.
2. The tentative schedule for the eight candidates seeking examiners for Colloquium I and II was briefly discussed.
3. Dr. Fenichel announced that the Faculty Committee would like Dr. Brunswick to become a member and the Education Committee approved of this appointment. Dr. Evans announced that he has asked Dr. Fielding to consider becoming a member of the Curriculum Committee and he should know the answer in a week. The Education Committee will approve of this selection if it is affirmed.

The meeting adjourned at 8:00 P.M.

Minutes of the Meeting

The following members of the Education Committee were present: Dr. Greenson, Chairman, Dr. Brunswick, Mrs. Deri, Drs. Evans, Fenichel, Friedman, Jokl, Kupper, McGuire, Rangell and Van der Heide.

1. Minutes of the meeting of May 12: The minutes of this meeting were corrected as follows: Dr. Van der Heide suggested that item 7(a) should read: "Dr. Fenichel submitted her resignation from the Child Analysis Committee, which was accepted by the Education Committee. Mrs. Ruben suggested that the Education Committee consider replacing Dr. Fenichel with either Dr. Van Dam or Dr. Ekstein. The Education Committee selected Dr. Van Dam for membership on this committee."

Minutes of the Special meeting of May 19: These minutes were corrected as follows: Mrs. Deri stated that she was absent at this meeting and should be so listed.

2. Annual Report of the Dean of the Training School:

Drs. Brunswick, Friedman and Van der Heide made several suggestions correcting different items in the Annual Report of the Dean. These items will be so corrected and the new version of the Annual Report will then be distributed to all members of the Institute and the Board of Trustees.

3. Admissions Committee:

(a) The Admissions Committee proposed that the Education Committee select Dr. Elliott Foxman for training in psychoanalysis. After a brief discussion, the Education Committee voted to do so.

4. The Chairman brought up for discussion a proposed change in Colloquium II which had originally been suggested by Dr. Jokl. The change consists of requiring all candidates to apply for permission to take Colloquium II within six months after having completed the academic curriculum. This application will then be discussed by the entire Education Committee who will decide as to the candidate's readiness to take Colloquium II. The Chairman of the Education Committee will then inform the candidate of the decision. This proposed change was accepted by the Education Committee and the candidates will receive the revised statement about Colloquium II.

5. The Education Committee voted to re-elect Dr. David Brunswick and Dr. Hanna Fenichel training analyst trustees of the Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis.

6. Faculty Committee:

Dr. Fenichel, Chairman of the Faculty Committee, reported on several proposals suggested by the members of the Faculty Committee:

(a) Teaching in the Institute will be done under three categories of instructors. Two of these categories are unofficial and only for the use by the Education Committee. The only official category of teacher is the title instructor.

Auditor: Any candidate or member wishing to audit a course may do so with the approval of the instructor of that particular course.

Assistant Instructor: To be considered for this unofficial position, one has to be a member of the Institute, approved by the Education Committee for auditing and active participation in a seminar under the leadership of a regular instructor.

Instructor: A member of the Institute who has demonstrated his readiness to teach independently. He will either have served capably as an assistant instructor and be recommended by the regular instructor and then by the Faculty Committee with final approval by the Education Committee, or he may have demonstrated his abilities by previous independent teaching within the Los Angeles Institute or in an equivalent Institute.

The Faculty Committee will inform the Education Committee of their evaluation of all potential instructors with the Education Committee making the final decision.

(b) It was recommended that all instructors in Child Analysis be considered as all other Faculty members. Drs. Abraham Gottesman, Recco Motto and Heiman Van Dam, who have taught in the Child Analysis program, were proposed for status as instructors in the Institute. The Education Committee agreed with this proposal. The Chairman of the Child Analysis Committee will be notified of these changes.

(c) The Faculty Committee suggested that Dr. Milton Wexler, who had taught a course on the Theory of Psychoses previously, be made an instructor and assigned the course "Schizophrenia, Paranoid States, and Allied Disorders" in the 3rd year of the curriculum. The Education Committee approved of this proposal.

(d) Dr. Hilda Rollman-Branch's request for permission to participate as an "auditor-assistant instructor" was approved by the Education Committee.

(e) In the future, all training analysts who conduct supervision and colloquia will be considered part of the Faculty of the Institute.

(f) Dr. Friedman suggested and the Education Committee agreed that there should be yearly meetings of the entire Faculty of the Institute.

(g) The Faculty Committee intends to meet regularly one week before the end of each academic trimester in order to arrange for the evaluation of courses. Furthermore, the Faculty Committee will meet jointly with the Curriculum Committee in order to decide upon suggestions for the assignment of courses. It is likely that there might be an increase in the number of members of the Faculty Committee in the future. The Child Analysis Committee will be asked to send a representative to those meetings where courses in Child Analysis will be considered.

7. The members of the Education Committee were asked to submit suggestions for the annual revision of the Bulletin which will go to press during the month of July.

8. Ad Hoc Committee:

(a) After some discussion, the Chairman of Education Committee appointed Dr. Van der Heide to be Chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee.

(b) The special tasks of this Committee were briefly reviewed:

(1) Review and revision of the procedures for the reappointment of training analysts.

(2) Study the relationship of the Education Committee and the training analysts in order to make it possible for training analysts to retain their status without being active members of the Education Committee and yet have the possibility to attend important Education Committee meetings.

(3) To examine the various functions of the Education Committee in order to suggest changes in function and distribution of responsibility which might make for more efficiency.

(4) It was also suggested that this Committee might try to find more suitable categories for candidates who are suspended or inactive, and pre-seminar, etc.

(c) The two proposals regarding an administrative coordinator and an educational consultant have been shelved.

9. Dr. Van der Heide, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, reported that the Education Committee had re-elected Dr. Ralph R. Greenson as Chairman of the Education Committee and Dean of the Training School. There was some discussion about the advisability of appointing an Assistant Dean but no decision on this matter was reached and the question was left open for future discussion.
10. Appointment of Committees:  
The re-elected Chairman of the Education Committee then proceeded to make the following appointments:
- (a) As Chairman of the Admissions Committee, it was felt that the Education Committee Chairman was best suited for this chairmanship so that he could remain the one continuing member of this important committee. The five regular members of the Admissions Committee at the present time will be Drs. Kupper, Fenichel, Vatz, McGuire and Friedman. Dr. Brunswick indicated his readiness to serve on this committee. In the near future, two members who have already served a longer period will be rotated with two new members.
- It was decided that the use of non-training analysts on the Admissions Committee shall continue. The same three people, namely Drs. Futterman, Rosengarten and Sperling, will be asked to continue. However, the Education Committee decided that non-training analysts may be used only in cases where more than three interviews are required. Then, only one non-training analyst will be used to evaluate any given applicant.
- It was decided that there will be no interviewing of applicants during the months of July and August unless an emergency situation would require this.
- (b) Dr. Richard Evans was reappointed Chairman of the Curriculum Committee. At the next meeting of the Education Committee, he will suggest the names of the other members of his committee.
- (c) Dr. Hanna Fenichel was reappointed Chairman of the Faculty Committee. She will report to the Education Committee at the next meeting her suggestions for additional members of this Committee.
- (d) The Chairman of the Education Committee will discuss with Mrs. Ruben whether she wishes to be reappointed as Chairman of the Child Analysis Committee. Furthermore, he will explain to her the relationship of the Child Analysis Committee to the Education Committee.
11. It was decided to hold the first regular meeting of the Education Committee on Thursday, October 6, 1960 at 7:30 P.M. The Admissions Committee will meet on Wednesday, October 5, 1960 at 1:00 P.M. If urgent business should arise prior to these meetings, a special meeting will be called.

12. Everybody wished everybody else a Happy Vacation.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 P.M.

Minutes of the Meeting

The following members of the Education Committee were present: Dr. Greenson, Chairman, Dr. Brunswick, Mrs. Deri, Drs. Evans, Fenichel, Friedman, Jokl, McGuire, Rangell, Van der Heide, and Vatz.

1. The minutes of the meeting of April 7, 1960 were corrected to read as follows:

Dr. Brunswick:

Item 2(2): "Dr. Leif K. Pratum should not be selected for training."

Item 2(3): "Dr. David Hartson should be selected for training."

Item 3(f): "Dr. Gerald Aronson's request for permission not to attend the continuous case seminar for this current trimester was approved in order that he might continue his special work with Rand Corporation."

Dr. Vatz:

Item 4(c) 1st sentence: "There was a brief discussion concerning the procedure for the selection of the Chairman of the Education Committee."

Dr. Brunswick:

Item 5(2) 1st and last sentences: "A course entitled "Emotional Disorders of Childhood" will be given in the last half of the Spring Trimester of the first year beginning with the Spring of 1960 and lasting for approximately six sessions." "(The current course will consist of five sessions."

Dr. Rangell:

Item 6(a) last sentence: "There was also some discussion in connection with a letter received from Dr. Motto about his difficulties in being certified in Child Psychiatry. It was decided that no action on our parts was indicated."

2. Training Analysts:

(a) The Chairman introduced some discussion about changing the relationship of the Education Committee to the status of training analyst. It was felt there would be some advantage in making it possible for training analysts to remain on active status without necessarily having to be a member of the Education Committee. There was also some discussion about reducing the size of the Education Committee to handle administrative procedures and to permit all training analysts to vote on certain matters of general importance. In order to better survey these proposals, a subcommittee was appointed to study these problems and to report back in the near future to the Education Committee. The subcommittee is composed of Drs. Brunswick, Friedman, and Van der Heide, with Dr. Rangell serving as consultant when needed.

(b) There was some discussion about the Manual for Training Analysts with special reference to the section on reappointment of training analysts. There was some feeling that an Ad Hoc Committee could best study the question of reappointment. In order to clarify this problem, the same subcommittee as mentioned above was asked to consider the problem of reappointment and to report back to the Education Committee.

(c) Dr. Lewy's request for leave of absence from the Education Committee was then discussed. In view of the foregoing discussion about proposed changes in the relationship of the Education Committee to training analyst status, it was felt that it would be best to postpone action on Dr. Lewy's request and to inform him that, in spirit, the Education Committee was agreeable to his suggestion but it was felt advisable to defer action until we are clearer ourselves about the situation between the Education Committee and the training analysts.

(d) Dr. Van der Heide reported on the Nominating Committee for Chairman of the Education Committee. The election of the Chairman will take place at the Annual Meeting in June.

3. Admissions Committee:

(a) The Admissions Committee briefly reviewed the qualifications and their impressions about three applicants. After some discussion, the Education Committee approved the following action in these cases:

(1) Dr. Joaquin Fuster was selected for training in psychoanalysis.

(2) Dr. Robert Minnick was selected for training in psychoanalysis.

(3) Dr. King Mendelsohn will be informed that the Education Committee has postponed a decision on his application and would like to re-evaluate his situation after he has completed his military service.

(b) The Education Committee agreed to request a recent photograph from the new applicants.

(c) The Education Committee agreed that in the future the term of active duty on the Admissions Committee shall be for one year but the appointments shall be staggered in order to preserve some continuity.

(d) It was agreed that the files on rejected applicants of more than six years duration may be moved from the current location and placed in an inactive storeroom.

4. Candidates:

(a) The Education Committee granted Dr. Arthur Malin the right to begin an unsupervised case of psychoanalysis.

(b) Dr. Brunswick and Dr. Evans reported on the satisfactory Colloquium I of Dr. Mark Orfirer. He is now permitted to undertake a case under supervision.

(c) Dr. Van der Heide briefly discussed the reasons for placing Dr. Hellinger on inactive status as he had requested. The admissions interviews of Dr. Hellinger were reviewed as well as some of the opinions expressed by the New York Institute. The Education Committee agreed to place Dr. Hellinger on inactive status.

(d) A letter from Dr. Edwin Price was read thanking the members of the Education Committee for his satisfactory training.

(e) Dr. Brunswick announced beginning supervision with Dr. James Mott. Dr. Rangell announced beginning supervision with Dr. Charles Furniss.

5. Curriculum Committee:

(a) The Education Committee approved Mrs. Ruben's suggestions for instructors for the course "Emotional Disorders of Childhood", i.e., one evening each for Drs. Miriam Williams, Robert Dorn, Heiman Van Dam, Hanna Fenichel and Rudolf Ekstein.

(b) There was a brief discussion of the Curriculum Committee meeting of Group II in San Francisco. Some of the causes for dissatisfaction with that meeting were explored.

(c) Dr. Evans announced the suggestions for instructors of the Clinical Conferences for the Fall Trimester, 1960. The Education Committee confirmed the following assignments:

Clin 201 - Brief Presentations (Problems of Analyzability)	Dr. Fenichel
Clin 401 - Continuous Case	
Section A	Dr. McGuire
B	Dr. Kupper
C	Dr. Brunswick

6. Faculty Committee:

(a) The Education Committee appointed Drs. Henry Lihn and Rudolf Ekstein as instructors on the Faculty for a two-year period.

(b) Dr. Bernard Brandchaft will be observed for an additional period before any decision will be reached.

(c) Dr. Sidney Fine was given permission to sit in at one of the courses in the Fall Trimester.

(d) The Education Committee acted favorably upon the acceptance of the Faculty Committee as a standing subcommittee of the Education Committee.

(e) It was noted that Dr. Robert Dorn is an instructor on the Faculty and not only an instructor in Child Analysis.

7. Child Analysis Committee:

(a) Dr. Fenichel submitted her resignation from the Child Analysis Committee which was accepted by the Education Committee. Mrs. Ruben will be asked to suggest someone in her place, which will then be submitted to the Education Committee for approval.

(b) The letter from Margarete Ruben was briefly discussed but action will only be taken in the Fall.

8. American Psychoanalytic Association-Board on Professional Standards:

Drs. Friedman and Greenson reported on the meeting of the Board on Professional Standards in Atlantic City. Dr. Rangell reported briefly on the meeting of the Executive Council and on the meeting of the general Membership.

9. Due to the lateness of the hour, the two proposals under New Business were not discussed but will be discussed at the next opportunity.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 P.M.

Minutes of the Meeting

Present at the meeting were Drs. Greenson, Brunswick, Mrs. Deri, Drs. Evans, Fenichel, Friedman, Jokl, Kupper, Lewy, McGuire, Rangell, Vatz and Van der Heide.

1. The minutes of the meeting of March 3, 1960 were accepted as distributed. The minutes of the Special Education Committee meeting of March 24, 1960 were corrected to read as follows:

Item 4 3rd sentence: "There was some uncertainty about the readiness of Drs. David Gottlieb, David Thiele, and Simon Horenstein for seminars.

Item 7 (a): "Dr. Jokl announced that Dr. Hyman Goodman was on inactive status and is now in psychotherapy with Dr. Walsh."

2. Admissions Committee:

The Admissions Committee recommended the following course of action:

- (1) Dr. Harold Arlen's application for training should be rejected.
- (2) Dr. Leif K. Pratum's application for training should not be selected.
- (3) Dr. David Hartson's application for training should be selected.

The Education Committee approved these recommendations.

3. Candidates:

(a) In discussing the length of time for suspension, the Education Committee recommended that every two years each individual on inactive status shall have his case briefly reviewed and re-evaluated.

(b) The Chairman announced the withdrawal from training of Dr. Peter King and Dr. Helen B. Wolff. The reasons were briefly discussed.

(c) The qualifications of Dr. Edwin Price were discussed in regard to his request for graduation. The Education Committee agreed that Dr. Price had successfully completed all the training requirements and was ready for graduation.

(d) The report of Dr. James Mott's Colloquium II was discussed by Drs. Lewy and McGuire. It was found that he had successfully completed Colloquium II.

(e) Drs. Rangell and Greenson were appointed the examiners for Dr. James Grotstein for Colloquium II. Drs. Fenichel and Van der Heid were appointed examiners for Dr. Marvin Berenson for Colloquium II.

(f) Dr. Gerald Aronson's request for permission to renounce the continuous case seminar for this current trimester was approved in order that he might continue his special work with Rand Corporation.

(g) The Chairman was authorized to drop certain older candidates who need not be present at the continuous case seminars in order to cut down the excessive number of candidates present.

4. Training Analysts:

(a) There was a brief review of the past discussion and brief further discussion concerning the reappointment of Dr. Jokl as Training Analyst. The Education Committee voted that he be reappointed.

(b) There was some discussion about the Training Analyst trustee whose terms expire in June. The Education Committee recommends that D Brunswick and Dr. Fenichel be considered for reelection.

(c) There was a brief discussion, initiated by Dr. Vatz, concerning the procedure for the selection of the Chairman of the Education Committee. The Education Committee agreed to try the following method. In April of the third year of the term, the Chairman will appoint at least two members of the Education Committee to serve as a Nominating Committee. They will report to the Education Committee in May on their suggestions. In June, the Chairman of the Education Committee will be elected. At the next meeting this procedure will be finalized. Drs. Van der Heide and Fenichel were asked to serve as the Nominating Committee for the next election of the Chairman of the Education Committee.

5. Curriculum Committee:

(a) Mrs. Margarete Ruben was present at the discussion of the Curriculum Committee suggestions from the Child Analysis Committee. The Education Committee approved the following suggestions.

(1) The course "The Normal Development of the Child" shall be given within the framework of the academic curriculum as a pre-first year seminar beginning in the Winter of 1961. The exact duration of this course is not certain but provisions are made for it to continue for 12 sessions and possibly longer. The Child Analysis Committee will suggest the teachers for this course, which will be ratified by the Education Committee. The teachers will be asked to prepare a bibliography and syllabus for this course as soon as possible.

(2) A course entitled "The Normal Development of the Child" will be given in the last half of the Spring Trimester of the first year beginning with the Spring of 1960 and lasting for approximately six sessions. The Child Analysis Committee will suggest the instructor and the Education Committee will ratify this. Here, too, syllabus and bibliography are requested. (The current session will consist of five sessions.)

(3) In the Clinical Conference: Brief Presentations, one session should be devoted to the presentation of emotional problems of children.

(4) In Clinical Conference: Dream Presentations, one session should be devoted to the presentation of dreams of children and adolescents.

(5) The course CH 401, Child Analysis, General is to be dropped from the curriculum.

(6) Special courses for candidates intending to specialize in Child Analysis shall begin in the third year. Details will be worked out at a future time. This will be an elective course.

(7) There was some discussion about the present group of candidates who are undergoing special instruction in Child Analysis. The question regarding their readiness to begin the treatment of a child under supervision was postponed until the Fall. This would be an experimental procedure.

(b) Dr. Greenson and Dr. Evans did not report about the Curriculum Committee meeting in San Francisco and the subsequent discussions about the curriculum because of the lateness of the hour. It was decided that a brief resume of these discussions will be circulated to the members of the Education Committee for their suggestions, comments, etc.

(c) Dr. Evans reported the suggestions of the Curriculum Committee and Faculty Committee for the academic courses for the year 1960-61. They are as follows:

(b) The Education Committee recommended and the Executive Committee approved that the Executive Secretary be sent to the Annual Meeting at the expense of the Institute.

7. Manual for Training Analysts:

Item 7 was not discussed due to the lateness of the hour but it was agreed that it shall be the second item on the next agenda.

8. Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society:

(a) The credentials of Dr. Frances Cottingham were favorably received by the Education Committee and she was recommended to apply for membership in the Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society.

(b) The status of Dr. Gottfried Bloch was reviewed. Dr. Friedman reported that his supervisory work with Dr. Bloch was satisfactory and the Education Committee decided that Dr. Bloch should be recommended for membership in the Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society.

There was no new business. The meeting was adjourned at 10:40 P.M.
