Gentlemen:

Dr. Milton L. Miller has asked me, as
Chairman of the Education Committee of the Los Angeles Institute
for Psychoanalysis, for the following statement:

After considerable discussion, it was
unanimously decided by the members of the Education Committee of
the Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis at a regular meeting
on February 2, 1950, that the only solution to the existing differences
of opinion about teaching and other matters was that three members of
the Education Committee withdraw from the Institute and, together with
another training analyst, apply for authority to form another psycho-
analytic institute in Los Angeles. This decision was arrived at in an
amicable way.
