Dear Walter:

Dr. Brunswick has asked me to bring you up-to-date about the status of the Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis, a California non-profit corporation. This corporation is not to be confused with the Psychoanalytic Institute Foundation of Los Angeles, nee Psychoanalytic Institute of Los Angeles.

I believe that in 1938 you handled the incorporation of a non-profit corporation known as the "Psychoanalytic Institute of Los Angeles." Subsequently, amended articles of incorporation were filed changing the name of the "Psychoanalytic Institute of Los Angeles" to "Psychoanalytic Foundation of Los Angeles." I understand that the activities of this corporation were discontinued due to the late, recent unpleasantness known as World War II. This corporation has never been dissolved.

In the latter part of 1946 or the early part of 1947 I handled the incorporation of a new California non-profit corporation known as the "Los Angeles Institute for Psychoanalysis." I understand this is the corporation under which functions are now being handled. However,
