Dear Mel:

You will recall that a letter of mine to Mrs. Kameon some weeks ago was referred to the Co-ordinating Council and then to you for reply. I wonder if this shouldn't set a precedent. I think it would make a lot of sense if all of my communications to the Los Angeles Society/Institute came first to you, even though you passed them - or some of them - on to others.

We are bound to be in a sort of transitional period for the next year or so. Some training business will belong to the Los Angeles Society/Institute and some to the Joint Committee. Some, in fact, will probably be intermediate or ambiguous, requiring clarification. I will certainly write to Sig and you jointly about matters that are unmistakably the business of the Joint Committee. If the others come to you, you will at least be informed and in a position to formulate your ideas in advance of decisions affecting these interim problems.

For example: The two names already referred to the Joint Committee's Admissions Committee may be a case in point. One of them, Dr. Decherwitz, is in analysis with me. When he began, it appeared that he would be returning to Cincinnati at the end of his Navy duty. Since then he has been accepted for training by the L.A. Society/Institute and has decided to remain here. Because of this, I have requested a waiver of the rule that limits an analyzing instructor to three candidates. Meanwhile, the Southern California Institute has referred his application to the Joint Committee.

The other applicant, Dr. Graner, has also been referred from the Southern California Institute. I think, but do not know for sure, that he too is already known to the Los Angeles Society/Institute. The question will arise, I can imagine: "Do we start afresh with either or both of these men, or do we rely on earlier interviews?" I assume, of course, that I do not participate in discussions or decisions affecting Dr. Uscherwile. Anyway, I'll approplate your ideas and decisions regarding these procedural matters.
