Minutes of the Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by Dr. Atkins, Vice-President, in the absence of the President, Dr. Leavitt. There were 41 members attending.

1. Minutes of the Special Joint Meeting of September 22, 1966:

The minutes of the meeting of September 22, 1966, were amended by the addition of the signature of Dr. Mandel, Secretary of the Society. This co-signature for the Joint Meeting was omitted by error.

2. Membership Committee - Dr. Atkins:

Drs. Andrew Patterson, Myron Rappaport, and Douglass Orr were accepted for Active membership in the Society.

3. Announcements - Dr. Atkins:

a. The Joint Committee is still working, has made some revisions in the new By-Laws, and will meet further.

b. There was a meeting of the Arrangements Committee and the Presidents of the constituent societies of the West-Coast Psychoanalytic Societies in the course of the recent West Coast meetings in San Francisco. The following proposals emerged from this meeting:

- 1) That an ongoing organization of Western Psychoanalytic Societies be formalized for the purpose of sponsoring and planning regular annual or biennial meetings.
- 2) That a host society be chosen for each meeting.
- 3) That this organization maintain a general fund to be used for arranging such conventions; this fund to be available to the host society.
- 4) That this general fund be acquired and maintained by assessing the component societies on a per capita basis. It is expected that the assessment will amount to \$5 per member.
- 5) Finally, that the Los Angeles Psychoanalytic Society and the Southern California Institute and Society be joint hosts for the next meeting, to take place about one year from now.

The fifth item on the agenda was the report of the Committee on the Proceedings of the Society. This report was read and approved.

The sixth item on the agenda was the report of the Committee on the Constitution and Bylaws of the Society. This report was read and approved.

The seventh item on the agenda was the report of the Committee on the Nominations for the Officers of the Society. This report was read and approved.

Motion: Dr. Gold moved, s/Dr. Branch, that the proposals of the West-Coast Psychoanalytic Societies be approved. After some discussion and clarification the motion was passed without dissent.

4. New Business:
