Minutes of the Meeting

Dr. Lihn, Acting Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. All members of the Education Committee were present except Mrs. Deri, Drs. Evans, Lewy and Rangell.

1. The minutes of the Education Committee meeting of May 6, 1965 were approved with the following corrections submitted by Dr. Van der Heide:

Item 2 - Dean of the Training School

"Dr. Leo Rangell was nominated for Dean of the Training School by Dr. Van der Heide."

Item 3(c) last sentence - Training Analysts:

"Dr. Van der Heide stated that the main content of the letter was a frank and unanimous expression of opinion of the Joint Committee at its last meeting 5/4/65, and that he was unfamiliar with the content of paragraph 4 of Dr. Walsh's letter."

2. A letter was received from Dr. Van der Heide proposing that the numerical vote on all motions and major transactions be announced and recorded in the minutes.

Motion: Dr. Van der Heide moved that from hereon and in the future, the Chairman will announce the vote (numerically) on all motions and major transactions voted on in the Education Committee meetings and that these results be recorded in the minutes. S/Dr. Greenson. 6 in favor, none opposed. Motion carried.

3. Report of the Dean of the Training School

(a) The Annual Report of the Dean of the Training School for 1964-1965 was received and accepted. Dr. Vatz and Dr. Lihn thanked Dr. Friedman for his excellent and comprehensive report.

(b) Dr. Friedman presided during the election of the Dean of the Training School for the year 1965-1966. Dr. Henry Lihn and Dr. Leo Rangell were nominated for Dean of the Training School at the May meeting of the Education Committee.

(c) A letter was read from Dr. Rangell declining the nomination.

5. Admissions Committee:

(a) Dr. Lihn announced that Dr. Rex Rook had withdrawn his application for psychoanalytic training.

(b) Dr. Peter Landres was accepted for psychoanalytic training.

(c) Dr. Lihn announced that Dr. Ron Blanchette and Dr. Jack Edelstein had withdrawn after acceptance.

6. Candidates:

This would bring the instructors into another phase of the work of the Training School. Dr. Van der Heide added the condition that the instructors should be approved by the Education Committee. (c) The recommendation of Dr. Jokl that Dr. Douglas McCorquodale be transferred to a second training analyst was approved. Dr. McCorquodale's request to take Colloquium I was deferred until after he resumes training analysis with a second training analyst.

(d) Dr. Charles White's status as a candidate in the Los Angeles Institute automatically expired at the end of the initial period of two years since no request for extension was received from him.

7. Curriculum Committee:

(a) It was decided to invite interested members of the Faculty to present in the continuous case seminars to be conducted by Drs. Van der Heide and Lihn in the Fall Trimester 1965 and others for succeeding trimesters to be supervised by a training analyst of their choice.
